- Systems Report: the County System approved our plans for an addition to the library; another Legislative Day is scheduled for May 11th.
- Keystone Grant Committee: we met with Curtis Moore, our library consultant, to modify his recommendations based on our plans to add onto the side of the building with architects Olsen and deTurk; we are paying Olsen and deTurk (Larry Smith) to complete our Historical Review and Environmental Impact forms. T. Wert made the motion to pay Olsen and deTurk \$200 for their services for the Keystone Grant. The motion was seconded by D. Beamesderfer and passed.
- Librarian's Report: Circulation in March 2004 was 3,321 as compared to 2, 673 in March 2003; Collection Expenditures for March 2004 totaled \$734.84.
- Librarian Search Committee: we interviewed three applicants; there is an ad in the paper; we will have a send-off party for Carol on Tues. May 25th in the library.
- Adjournment: C. Edwards made the motion to adjourn at 8:50p.m., seconded by V. Cook

Senator Brightbill came to tour the library and talk about funding the new addition. He asked if we would consider debt service since interests rates are so low. He indicated that it was easier to get money from the state if we were asking for the last \$ rather than the 1st. Also, it is easier to get money from the state for bricks & mortar. He asked about our community fundraising or if someone wanted their name on a library. He suggested we stage the project and ask the architects to send him the numbers. Senator Brightbill explained that it would be hard for him to get even 10% of \$400,000.00 before June. The State was without a budget for one and one half years. There are four caucuses vying for money.
